Position descriptions excerpted from our bylaws (upshotmd.org/cppv/bylaws.pdf):

The President shall convene regularly scheduled Board meetings and shall preside or arrange for other Officers to preside at each meeting. The President may sign all contracts and agreements in the name of CPPV after the Board has approved them, serve as the representative of CPPV in meetings and discussions with other organization. After the election, the current president will continue to edit the newsletter, file the tax returns, as well as maintain the web site and CPPV email list. So step up future CPPV president, you have it easy!

The Treasurer shall oversee: the deposit of CPPV funds into the proper accounts; the recordation of all receipts and disbursements from such accounts; the preparation of the books and records of the finances of CPPV; the preparation of financial reports of the accounts for each board meeting; and the preparation and filing of all end of the year financial report. Our finances are very simple, so reports are less than a page!
